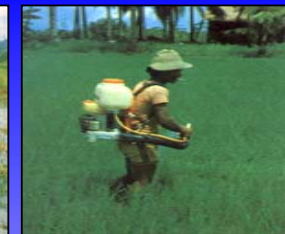

FOREWORD

This report has been generated from the results of the Integrated Farm Household Survey (IFHS) which collected important benchmark characteristics of farms and farming population in the country. The IFHS, with reference period July 2002 to June 2003, covered 5,920 farm households nationwide except in Batanes and Lanao del Sur. It utilized a two-stage stratified sampling design with provinces as the domain and the barangays and farm households as the primary and secondary sampling units, respectively. The sample barangays were drawn from the 1999 Barangay Screening Survey of the Bureau of Agricultural Statistics and were set at 6 for small provinces and 9 for large agricultural provinces. For each sample barangay, 10 sample farm households (i.e. those households with at least one member engaged in agricultural activities) were randomly selected using the 2000 Census of Population and Housing of the National Statistics Office.

This report puts together the statistical data that can characterize the **socio-economic conditions of farm households in Central Visayas**. To enhance appreciation and understanding of the regional condition, the national level data are included in the presentation of statistical tables. Other details of data regarding the region are contained in the IFHS main report entitled "Socio-Economic Characteristics of Farm Households in the Philippines".

HIGHLIGHTS

Household Characteristics

- The size of farm households in the region averaged 4.80.
- Almost 90 percent of the households were headed by males. Average age of the household heads was 53 years.
- About 98 percent of the household heads had formal education. Nearly 17 percent finished elementary education, while 5 percent each were high school and college degree holders.
- Farming was the main occupation of 70 percent of household heads. Corn farmers were 42 percent of the household heads and 14 percent were palay farmers.

Farm Characteristics

- More than 91 percent of the farm households were engaged in crop farming and livestock and poultry raising.
- The average number of farm parcels operated by households was 1.80. Fully owned farm parcels had the biggest average size of 0.88 hectare. The smallest at 0.37 hectare were parcels operated under rent-free agreement.
- About 65 percent of the farm parcels were planted to temporary crops. Homelot occupied 21 percent.
- Only 10 percent of the region's farm parcels were irrigated and 54 percent had their own irrigation system.
- Average inventory of farm investments in the region was small at P1,446 for farm building and structures, P1,411 for farm machineries and transport equipment, P804 for farm tools, equipment and other supplies and P63 for fishing gears.

Farm Enterprise

- Corn was the crop grown by the majority or 97 percent of the households. Coconut was also cultivated by 61 percent of households.
- Backyard raising of livestock and poultry was more common among households. Raising in commercial scale was reported by only 3 percent of households.
- All households were engaged in marine fishing while 43 percent were also involved in gathering of shells, aquarium fish, etc.
- Only 3 percent of the households were into fishpond operations.

Income and Expenditure Patterns

- Annual income of farm households averaged P72,177. About 43 percent of household income or P31,055 came from non-farming activities. Farm income contributed 39 percent to total income which amounted to P28,074.
- The bulk or 52 percent of the farm income came from crop farming. Around 33 percent came from livestock and poultry raising.
- About 44 percent of income from crop farming came from palay and corn production.
- By farm enterprise, capture fishing and aquaculture generated the highest net returns at P17,925. This amounted only to P4,708 in crop farming and P738 in livestock and poultry raising.
- Annual expenditures of farm households averaged P69,533. The biggest portion of household expenditures at 45 percent was spent for food. Farm expenses accounted for 29 percent.
- Cereals shared 36 percent in total food expenditures. Fish and marine products accounted for 21 percent while meat and meat preparations shared 13 percent.
- Recurring expenses of households comprised 11 percent of the total household expenditures with 29 percent was spent for household operations, 25 percent for fuel, light and water, and 21 percent for transportation and communication.
- Non-recurring expenses share 15 percent in household expenditures. Education accounted for 37 percent of the total non-recurring expenses.

Credit Information

- Of the total farm households, almost 13 percent availed of loans worth less than P100,000. About 29 percent of the borrowers availed loans for business purposes and 21 percent each for agricultural production, education and emergency use.

Access to Government Program

- Awareness on government programs in crop farming was cited by 57 percent of farm households. About 28 percent of the households showed familiarity with programs on livestock and poultry raising and only 1 percent on capture fishing and aquaculture.
- Only few households were benefited with programs on crop management with 7 percent of households reporting, 3 percent in development program on capture fishing and aquaculture, and only 1 percent on animal dispersal program.
