This report has been generated from the results of the Integrated Farm Household Survey (IFHS) which collected important benchmark characteristics of farms and farming population in the country. The IFHS covered 5,920 farm households nationwide except in Batanes and Lanao del Sur. Details of the survey including its methodology and statistical outputs are found in the main report entitled "Socio-Economic Characteristics of Farm households in the Philippines".

This report presents information on the characteristics of farm households, farm characteristics, household income and expenditures, credit information and access to government programs. On the whole, it has been designed to serve as a handy reference material for our clients and stakeholders in agricultural development planning and policy formulation, and agriculture-based entrepreneurial decision-making.

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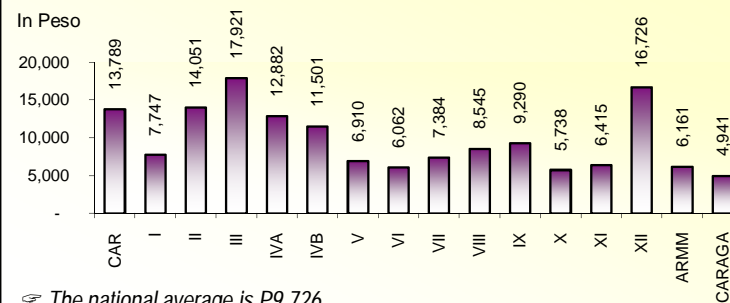
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HIGHLIGHTS

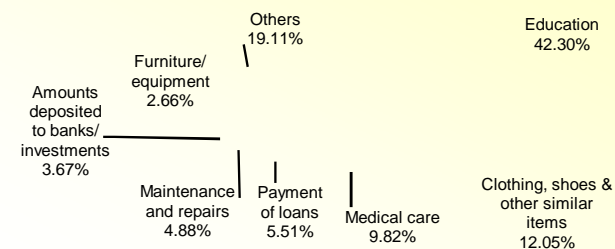
- The national average size of farm households was 5.07. Nationwide, the age of household heads averaged 49 years. Household heads who finished elementary education comprised 16.45 percent, 13.78 percent were high school graduates and only 4.67 percent were college degree holders.
- The main occupation of 79.05 percent of household heads was farming followed by fishing with 5.79 percent.
- Household heads who are members of community development organizations accounted for only 6.33 percent while members of cooperatives were 9.57 percent.
- The average size of farm operated and managed by households was 1.63 hectares. About 77 percent of farm parcels had areas of 2 hectares and below.
- Of the total number of farm parcels operated by households, 44.13 percent were fully owned. About 23.66 percent were tenanted, 5.55 percent were leased/rented, 8.88 percent were rent free, 4.46 percent were held under CLT/CLOA, and 13.31 percent were held under owner-like possession.
- Most farm parcels or 55.15 percent were planted to temporary crops. Those planted to permanent crops accounted for 21.35 percent.
- The share of irrigated farm parcels in total farm area was 22 percent. National Irrigation System serviced 29.96 percent of the total irrigated farms, Communal Irrigation System serviced 35.69 percent, and individual irrigation system addressed the irrigation needs of the remaining 34.35 percent.
- On the average, the biggest investment of farm household was in farm machineries and transport equipment at P6,258.
- At the national level, 93.18 percent of households were engaged in crop farming, 72.42 percent in livestock and poultry raising, 13.32 percent in capture fishing and aquaculture. Only 2.74 percent were engaged in special agricultural activities and home processing of agricultural products.
- About 54.27 percent of household income came from farming. Of the total farm income, 73.21 percent came from crop production. Livestock and poultry raising contributed 13.82 percent. Capture fishing and aquaculture shared 12.05 percent. Special agricultural activities and home processing of agricultural products provided only 0.92 percent.
- Food accounted for the biggest portion of household expenditures at 64.26 percent. Non-recurring and recurring expenses accounted for 20.19 percent and 15.55 percent of the total household expenditures, respectively.
- About 22.95 percent of households availed of loans mostly for agricultural production.
- Majority of farm households or 80.32 percent were aware of government programs on agriculture and fishery. About 8.35 percent of households were recipients of government programs on crop farming, 7.28 percent on livestock and poultry raising, and 7.51 percent on capture fishing and aquaculture.

Figure 73. Average annual expenditures of farm households for recurring items by region



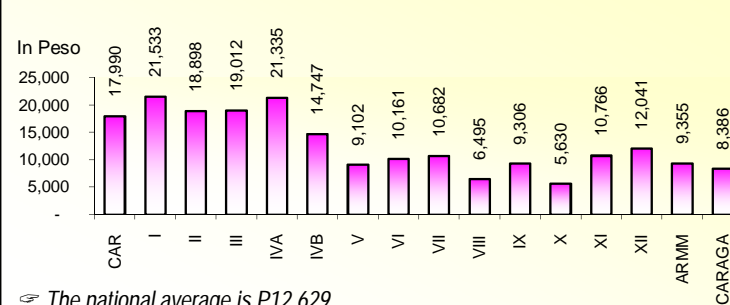

Figure 74. Percentage distribution of household expenditures for non-recurring items by type



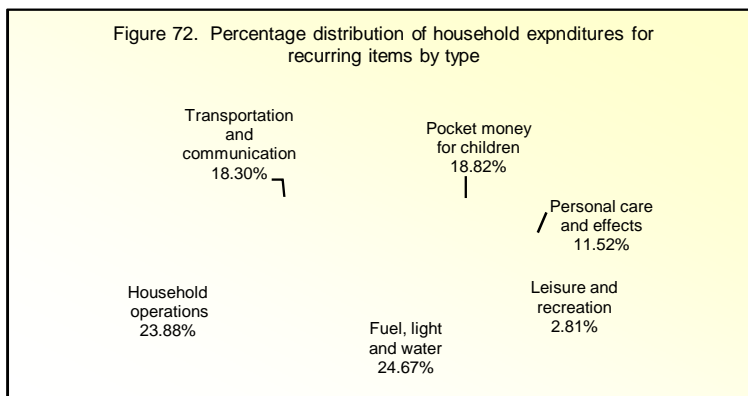
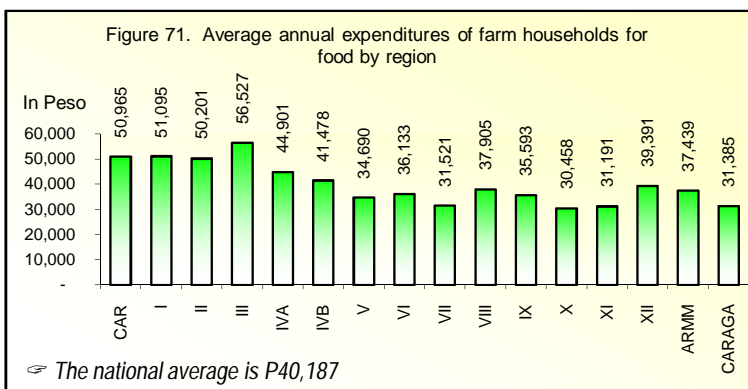
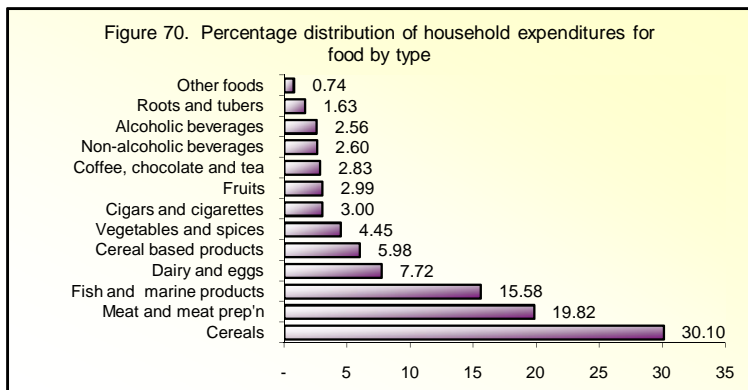

Figure 75. Average annual expenditures of farm households for non-recurring items by region

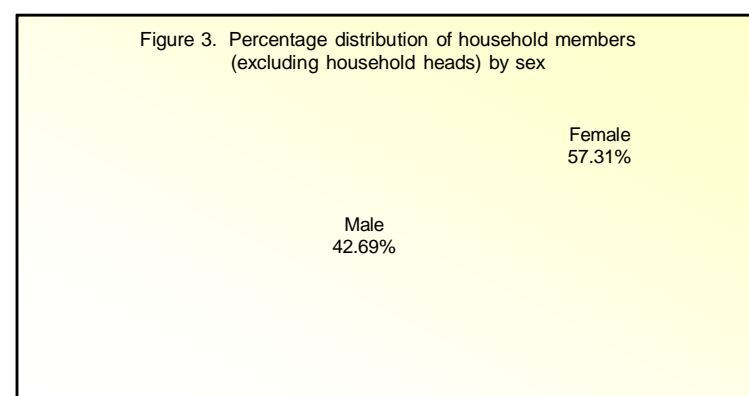
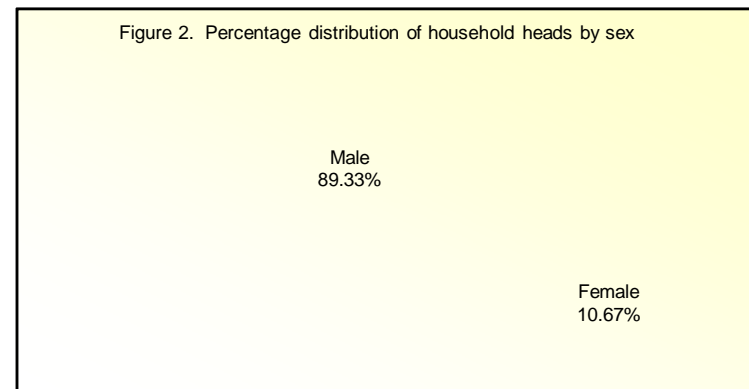
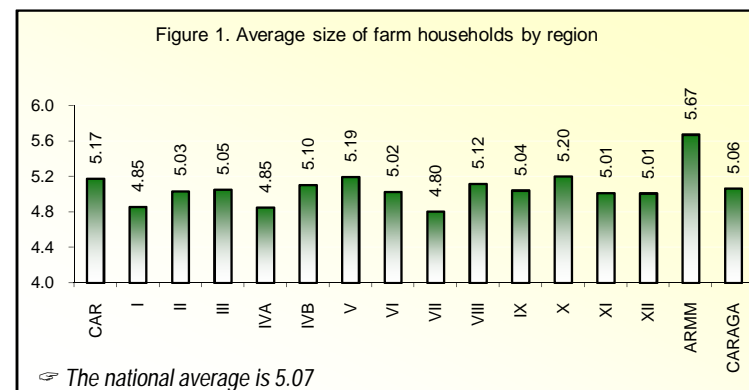

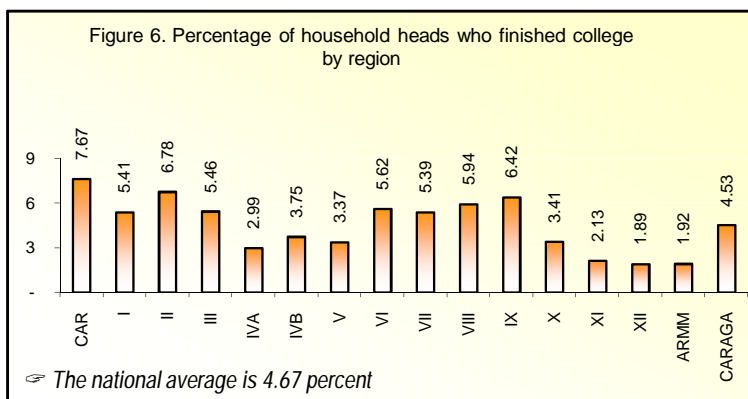
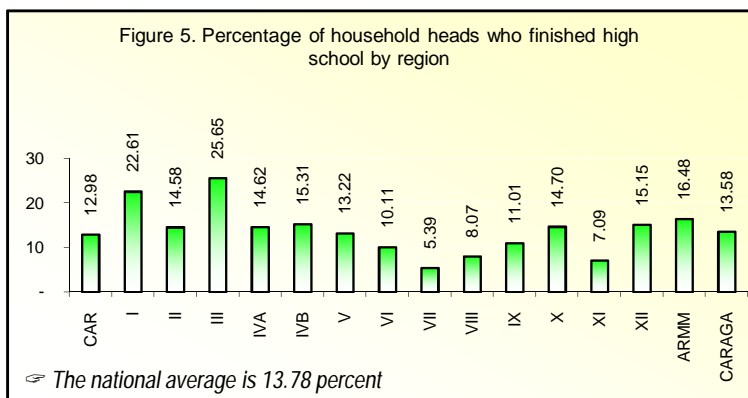
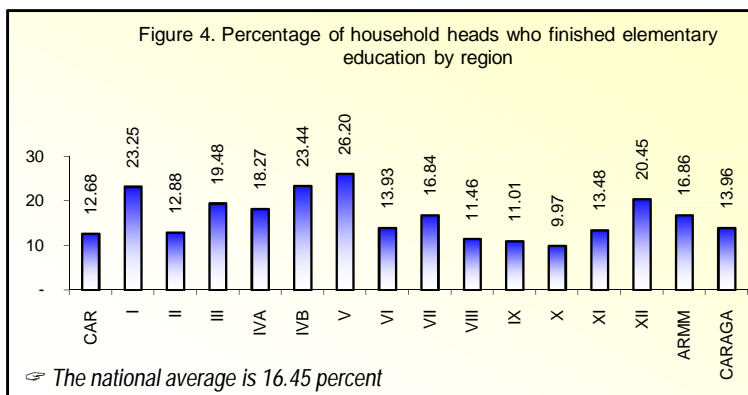


A. Household Size and Distribution by sex

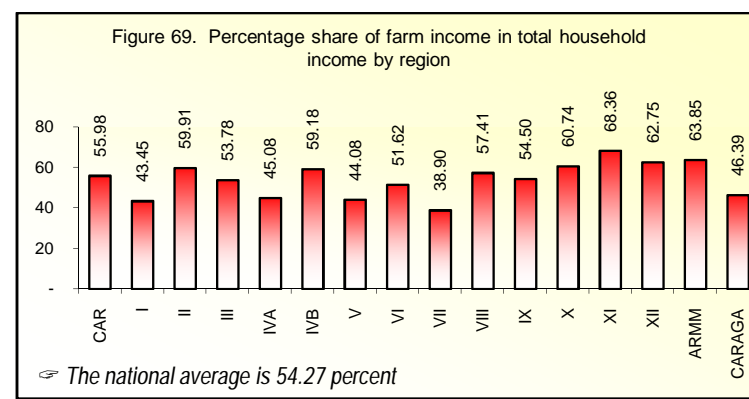
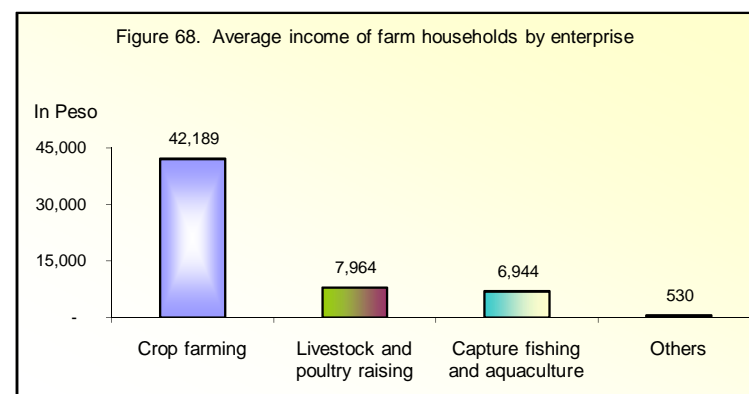
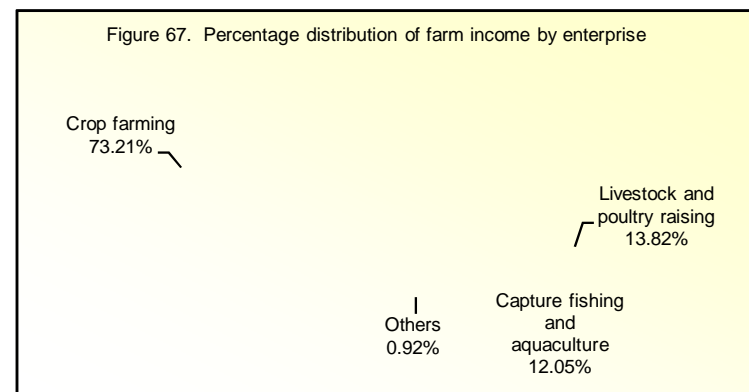

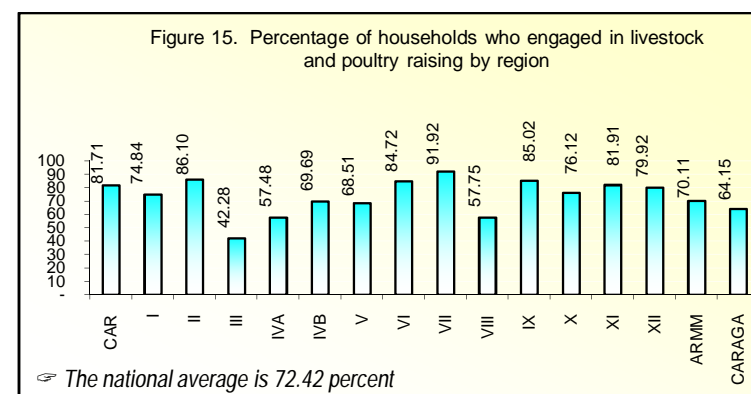
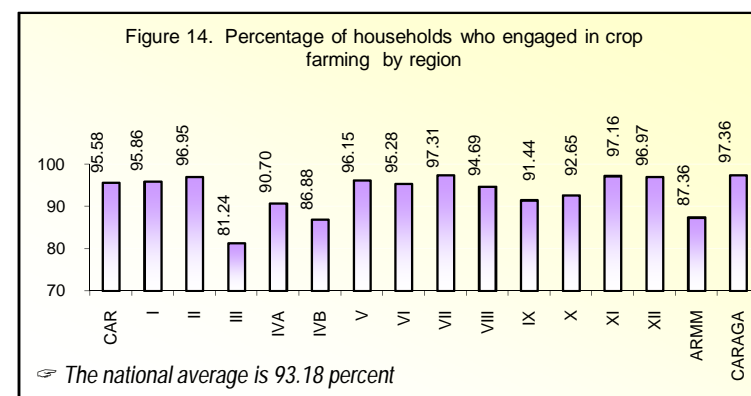
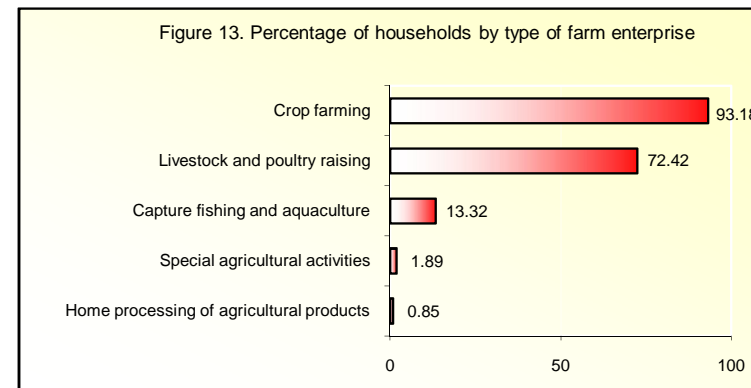


Figure 16. Percentage of households who engaged in capture fishing and aquaculture by region

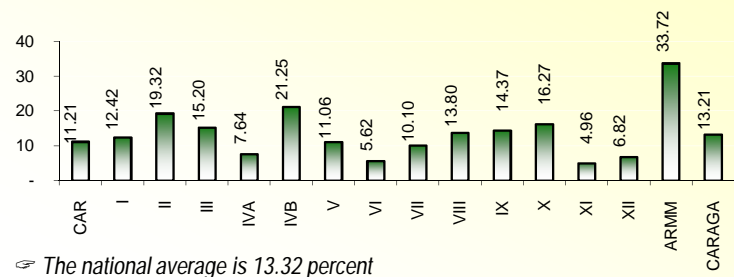


Figure 17. Percentage of households who engaged in special agricultural activities by region

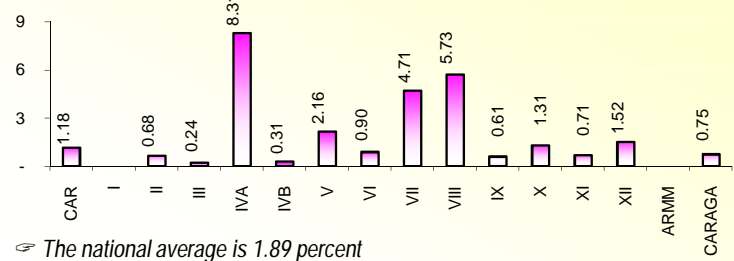


Figure 18. Percentage of households who engaged in home processing of agricultural products by region

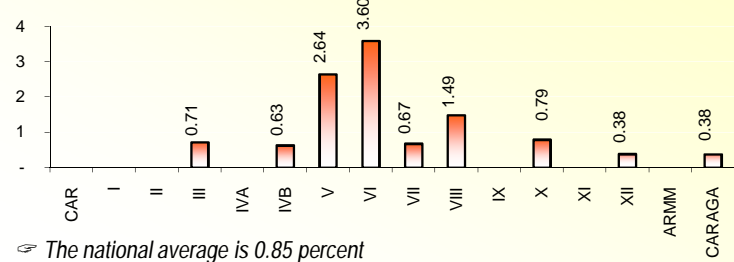
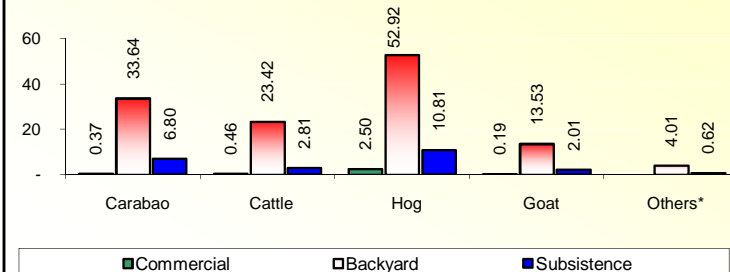


Figure 55. Percentage of households raising livestock by purpose / farm type

Figure 56. Percentage of households engaged in poultry raising by region

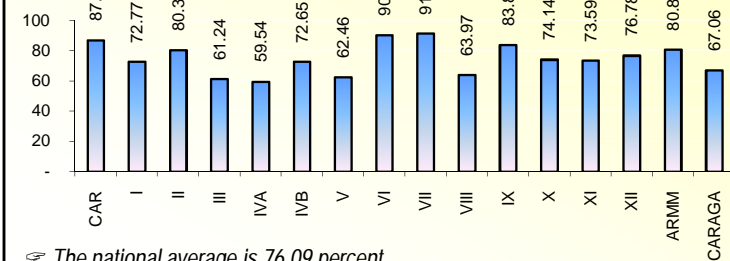
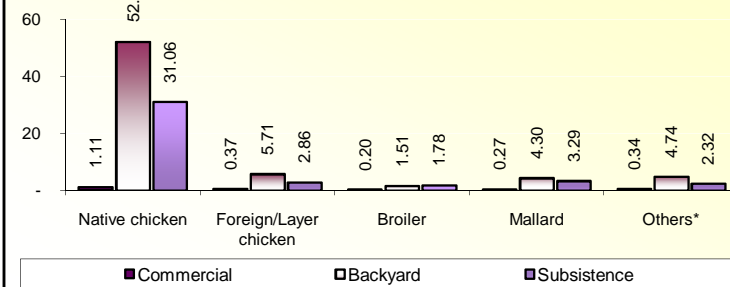
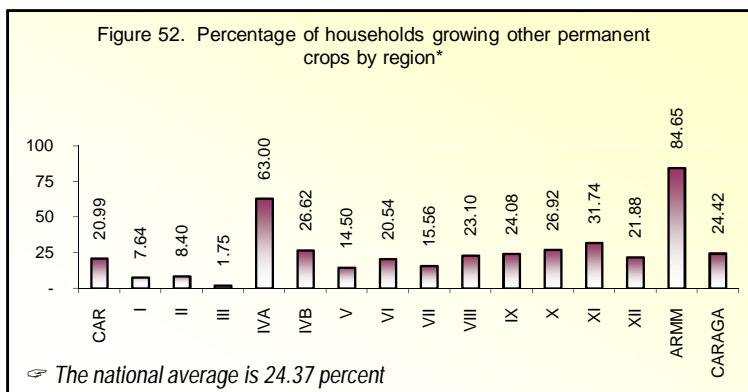


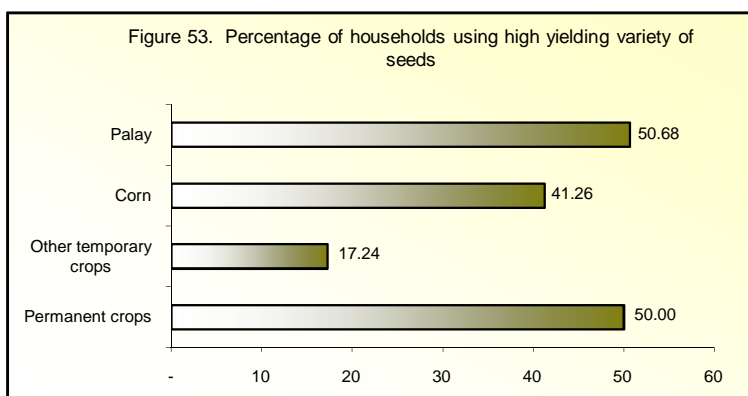
Figure 57. Percentage of households raising poultry by purpose / farm type



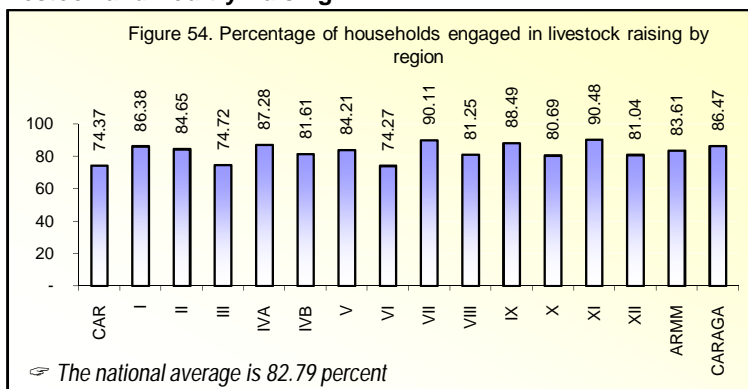
