**P1 Person number:**

- If Age is really unknown, try to relate to some major events that happened in Samoa in the past like the Epidemic in 1918, First Independence in 1962, Hurricane in 1966 and the Election in 1991 and try to estimate the age of that person at that time compared to November 5<sup>th</sup>, 2001.

**Example: 1. Birth date (Sina) = 10/04/1960 Completed Age by November 5, 2001 = 41 years**

Service workers and shop and market sales: main tasks require the knowledge at Secondary education and experience necessary to provide personal and protective services and to sell goods in shops and at markets such as providing services related to travel, housekeeping, catering, personal care, protection of individuals and property, and to maintaining law and order.
06. Skilled agricultural workers: main tasks consist of growing and selling agricultural produce requiring Sufficient knowledge and experience to carry out these activities
07. Skilled fishery workers: main tasks consist of catching, cultivating and selling fish requiring Sufficient knowledge and experience to carry out these activities
08. Craft and related trades: main tasks consist of producing various articles made of wood, textiles, leather, and also the processing of food products for selling and home-use requiring Sufficient knowledge and experience to perform these tasks
09. Plant and Machine operators and Assemblers: main tasks requiring understanding of operating machinery and understanding procedures followed in assembling goods thus needs Secondary education
10. Elementary occupations: covers occupations requiring most simple and routine tasks such as selling goods in streets, door keeping and property watching, as well as cleaning, washing, pressing, and working as labourers in agriculture and fishing, construction and manufacturing. These tasks require only Primary educational level.
